National Briefing | South: Georgia: Settlement In Crematory Case

A federal judge has approved a settlement agreement between family members and the operator of the Tri-State Crematory in Noble, who is accused of failing to burn hundreds of corpses. The \$80 million agreement, approved Thursday by Judge Harold L. Murphy of Federal District Court, says the 1,672 plaintiffs can receive payments from the insurance company of the operator, Ray Brent Marsh, left, but cannot go after the assets of Mr. Marsh or his family. Mr. Marsh still faces 787 criminal charges in the case.
